God's Encouraging Word ... when I am fearful about the future

2019 is here. For some, it's scary how quickly 2018 disappeared. For others, they can't wait to turn the page because this is the year they plan to graduate or perhaps get married. In either case, however, who of us knows what 2019 will bring? In all seriousness, who of us knows what tomorrow will bring?

If you've ever worried or fretted about the future, our gracious God has given us a very powerful verse, nestled right in the middle of the Old Testament book of Jeremiah. The prophet Jeremiah was one who had very good cause to be worried about the future. Day after day he took a beating because he stood up for God's truth and proclaimed God's Word. 





COUNCIL NOTES IN BRIEF

The church council held a regular meeting on Tuesday, December 18.

Here are the highlights.

- The council began as always with Bible study. Pastor Ewings led a study on Proverbs, chapter I, with a focus on wisdom.
- The following membership changes were ÷ presented and approved:

Release of Dave Nelson and his daughter Lauren due to a move from the area.

God has recently declared three children his children through baptism. Wells Thomas O'Brien. Isabella Mina Boerner. Jacob Robert Cate.

Verona membership stands at 331 baptized members. Monroe campus membership stands at 78 members.

November average attendance. Monroe: 47 ÷ on Sunday, 7 on Monday for 54 total; 21 attended Thanksgiving service. Verona: 163 on Sunday, 35 on Thursday for a total of 198.

æ The council was in unanimous agreement to apply for funding assistance for a Vicar for the 2019/2020 year. The application will happen in January/February, with decision if we will get a vicar in March or April, and call day May 23 most likely.

- æ The next congregational meeting was set for January 27 at 11:45 am. Technology will be used to connect both campuses.
- Treasurer reported with gladness that No-÷ vember offerings were \$10,000 higher than budget and cash flow is very good. However, for the year, offerings are about \$20,000 lower than budget.
- Several facility repairs have been done at ÷ both locations. Additional stain glass windows have been installed in Verona.
- The next council meeting is set for January ₽ 15, 2019. Input is always welcome.

God's grace has opened doors to an unprecedented mission opportunity in communist Vietnam.

It all started when Zang Lou, a leader within the Hmong Fellowship Church (HFC) in Vietnam, viewed an online sermon by WELS Pastor Bounkeo Lor in 2011. The clear proclamation of law and gospel and the message of pure grace through Jesus Christ was something he had never heard before . . . and he wanted to learn more. That same year, Zang Lou invited Lor to come to Vietnam to train the HFC in the truth of the gospel. Lor made his first training visit in 2012. Since that time, Lor has made over 24 different trips to Hanoi, Vietnam. To assist in his training, members of the Pastoral Studies Institute (PSI) began to accompany him on some of these trips starting in 2016.

With every visit Lor has made to conduct training in Hanoi, approximately 60 church leaders have attended to learn more about the truths of the Bible. These same 60 leaders have been taking the message back to their rural congregations, preaching the message of salvation by faith, not by works – something the members had never heard before. The HFC was a church body of 55,000 members when Zang Lou first reached out to WELS. In the years WELS has provided training, the HFC has grown from 55,000 to over 100,000 members and formed many new churches. HFC leaders have seen the growth and the joy that Lutheran teaching has brought to their congregations and have expressed a desire to become a confessional Lutheran church body. The Opportunity

The message of free grace received from Jesus Christ has replaced their old law-based preaching: Grace has brought peace to the Hmong Fellowship Church, and church leadership has stabilized as a result. The communist government in Vietnam has noticed this positive change.

The Vietnamese government has invited WELS to build a theological training facility in the capital city of Hanoi.

This is an incredible, unprecedented opportunity for our synod. WELS is currently the only protestant church with official government permission to work with the Hmong in Vietnam. The Lord is opening a door to reach the more than two million Hmong people who live in Vietnam and the surrounding countries. However, this door can close at any time. Our WELS World Missions team is working quickly to ensure WELS is taking full advantage of the time the lord has provided.

WELS is collecting a special offering through June 2019, with the goal of raising \$2 million to purchase land, construct the campus, and cover the initial two years of operational costs.
