Man Dies to Save Trapped Bunny pops up as you scroll through your news app. You tap on the video. You see what reminds you of the furry little Cadbury Creme Egg mascot. A heroic rescue follows.

You're baffled. You're impressed! You think...*What inspired that guy to give his own life for a bunny? Come to think of it, I sometimes forget even to feed my own pet!*

Try another headline: **Man Dies to Save World**. That headline actually does pop up when you read the Bible. At first it may sound like it's from a too-predictable superhero movie. It seems too good to be true. But it is true! Jesus is that man. He died an agonizing, humiliating death on a Roman torture-pole to save the world. He wasn't saving it from global warming or hunger or war, but saving it from damnation. And despite what some speculate, Jesus didn't come to post the 10 commandments at every town hall and enforce them. No, the world *already* stood condemned by the law because of its sin. Instead, Jesus came to rescue the world. By the way, "world" means everyone in it. You too!

Look at the extraordinary heroism in Jesus, this world's Rescuer! Really, it was more than heroism. He, being true God, displayed God's love and God's plan to give forgiveness and eternal life to all! Jesus' life, death, and bodily resurrection show us the very heart of God. This is a headline worth your time. It is worth hearing and reading more about. Scroll on.

Here's a way to picture Jesus your God and Savior: Jesus is *The Good Shepherd*. He describes himself, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). We're the sheep. We've strayed and "bleated up" life because we're sinful. We are lost sheep needing rescue. Not just by a hired hand. Not just by any shepherd, but by *The Good Shepherd*. Not just a no-name hero, forgotten tomorrow. Jesus is the good shepherd who, being both God and man, laid down his life for you. He really did save the whole world. Your sins are forgiven.



Blooming Button Flowers

For Mother's Day, add a special touch to any houseplant with this easy craft.




What you need:

- A small houseplant with leaves
- Colorful buttons of various sizes
- Green 26-gauge floral wire
- Wire cutters

What you do:

1. Stack three buttons from largest to smallest, with the smallest on top. Align the button holes.
2. Cut 8 inches of wire. Thread it up through one hole of the stacked buttons and back down through another hole.
3. Twist the wire just below the bottom side of the button stack to secure it.
4. Insert the "flower" in the plant's soil and repeat the process.
5. Present this to Mom and wish her a happy Mother's Day!

After months of prayer, and on the third try, we have a pastor for Good News Lutheran Church. Pastor Jon Bauer has accepted the call to serve in Mount Horeb! Pastor Bauer will tentatively arrive around July 1 to begin serving our congregation and community. He currently serves at Emmanuel in Tempe, Arizona. Please keep the congregation at Emmanuel in your prayers as they begin the calling process for a new pastor.

Pastor Bauer comes highly recommended from several sources and has impressed people with his gifts for outreach. Pray that his work will be blessed and more people will hear the good news and be brought to faith in Jesus.

Ten new members were welcomed on April 6. What a blessing! Most were transfers from Resurrection in Verona. One transfer was from Texas. She grew up in Mount Horeb and has moved back home. Our current membership at Good News is just over forty and worship attendance averages about the same number. On a typical Sunday, about half of the congregation are children. We also have five to ten prospects in worship on average each Sunday.

We have a spring open house planned for April 26. The city wide garage sales are in Mount Horeb that weekend. We are partnering with our neighbors in the mini mall to serve as a rest station where people can relax for a while, get some free refreshments, use the restroom, let their children unwind with some kids' activities and see our facility. We thank Kwik Trip for donating brats for us to give away that day.

We thank Bob and Sharon Garbe, volunteers from Kingdom Workers, who have helped us canvass. They came to Mount Horeb on April 10-11 to assist with following up on prospects and handed out several copies of the DVD, "Come, Follow Me."

Our current Pastor, Nathan Strutz, will be speaking to an LWMS group on April 26 in Marshall about our congregation and our mission work. He will also be speaking at Good Shepherd in Holmen on May 4 as part of a mission festival.
