Holy Communion

The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." - 1 Corinthians 11:23-25

Often we have a hard time believing that we are loved. Men and women who have a keen awareness of their flaws will wonder if anyone can really love them. So we have a need to not only hear that we are loved, but also to receive tangible assurance of that love.

If we need that assurance from our fellow human beings, how much more do we need that assurance in our relationship to God?

God knows us so well. He knows how we feel. He knows what we need. Not only does he tell us in his Word that he loves us, he also gives us personal assurance of that love.

How does he do that? He does so in what Christians call *Holy Communion* or *The Lord's Supper*. In this special meal Jesus gives us bread that isn't just bread.

He tells us, "This is my body." He also gives us wine to drink that isn't just wine. He says, "This is my blood."

Now before anyone gets grossed out, this isn't some kind of weird cannibalism. It's bread and wine that looks, smells, and tastes like bread and wine. Yet, in a way that we can't perceive or comprehend, Jesus tells us that with the bread and wine, his body and blood are really present in this Supper.

Here's why this is such a great gift. You may think, "I know that Jesus forgives all those other people out there, but I'm not really sure that he can forgive me." In Holy Communion, Jesus comes to you personally and says, "I love you. Your sins are all forgiven. You want proof? Here's the price I paid for you on the cross. This is my body which was sacrificed for you. This is my blood which I shed for you."

Whenever we receive the Lord's Supper, we remember Jesus' saving, self-sacrificing love for us, and we personally receive not only assurance of that love, but we also receive his forgiveness.

In Holy Communion, Jesus comes to you personally and says, "I love you. Your sins are all forgiven. You want proof? Here's the price I paid for you on the cross. This is my body which was sacrificed for you. This is my blood which I shed for you."

CHRISTIAN AID & RELIEF

WELS Christian Aid and Relief has been monitoring damage to WELS churches, members, and communities in the Southeastern United States following Hurricane Florence. So far, only Ascension in Jacksonville, NC, has reported significant damage. The congregation's rented worship facility lost shingles in the wind, allowing torrents of rain to destroy the ceiling and fill the worship space. Christian Aid and Relief is still awaiting reports regarding how other area WELS members and communities fared.

Rev. Bob Hein, chairman of Christian Aid and Relief, reported that Christian Aid and Relief approved a \$10,000 gift to Direct Relief, a secular relief organization that is providing immediate relief to people affected by Hurricane Florence. Hein reports, "We are also assessing ways to personalize our relief efforts by working through our chuches in the affected areas."







HIGHLIGHTS

COUNCIL NOTES IN BRIEF

The council met on Tuesday, September 18. Here are some highlights:

- The council continued a study of 1 Timothy, looking at chapter 6: Leaders know and teach what true wealth is.
- There was some discussion, but no decision about the possibility of modifying the rotation of pastor and vicar on Sunday morning to allow for less travel on Sunday morning.
- Jeff Hartwig was granted transfer to St. Mark's in Watertown, due to a move to that area. Paul and Bobbi Jo Stiteley were received into membership at Resurrection by transfer from St. Andrew in Middleton. Current membership stands at 414; 336 Verona Campus, 78 Monroe Campus. Communicant membership is 323; 253 Verona Campus, 70 Monroe Campus.

- Outreach team reported with joy that during August there were 18 first time guests in worship in Verona and 12 in Monroe. There are currently ten people in Bible 101/201/301 classes between our two campuses.
- Worship attendance for August in Monroe averaged 47 each week; 42 on Sunday, and 5 on Monday. Verona attendance averaged 196 each week; 150 on Sunday, and 46 on Thursday. The Thursday number is higher than usual due to VBS closing worship on August 2, which had over 100 people in attendance.
- The treasurer reported with thanks to God that offerings in August were more than \$15,000 over budget. The 2017/2018 finscal year ended with offerings over \$20,000 above the budgeted amount.
- The property chairman, along with all councilmen, thank all members for their countless hours of volunteer service.
- ⊕ The next council meeting was set for Tuesday, October 16.
- ⊕ The next congregational meeting has been set for October 28 at 11:45 am. Technology will be used to connect both campuses So you can attend the meeting at either location.
